

SCOPE OF WORK

The Rhode Island Department of Transportation Division of Highway & Bridge Maintenance currently owns and operates a Maintenance garage at its Kent Maintenance Division Facility located on 2400 New London Avenue in East Greenwich, Rhode Island. The existing Facility measures 62 Feet wide, 180 Feet long and is typically 32 Feet high. The facility includes personal offices, bathrooms, mechanics area, truck storage bays, and oil storage and generator room. The work on the main building will be focused replacing all the steel entrance doors and the steel jambs.

The contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, equipment, tools, transportation and all incidental supplies required to complete the work. All work shall be in accordance with the plans, specifications and terms of the contract. There will be a Pre-bid meeting scheduled at the site on _____ to review the project and answer any questions.

Listed below are Specific details and a Description of the work to be completed as part of the contract:

1. The contractor will be responsible for the work schedule and the coordination of work.
2. The Contractor shall be responsible for any RIDEM, CRMC, OSHA, Department of Health, and all State building permits and inspections which are required .
3. The contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, equipment, tools, transportation and all incidental supplies required to the proper completion of the rehabilitation of this project.
4. The contractor is responsible for sealing off work area from remainder of facility.
5. The contractor is responsible for removing all materials to be R&D of from the site.
6. The contractor is responsible for portable toilet facilities for workmen.
7. Keep work area clean and safe for all personnel

MAIN BUILDING

OFFICE ENTRANCE SIDE

- There are two (2), exterior steel entrance doors; one is the main entrance door to the office, and a second located approximately in the center of the building near a small wooden shed. The office door is a 36"inch x 84"inch, right hand out swing. The door near the shed is a 36"inch x 80"inch, left hand out swing.

REAR OF BUILDING

- There are two (2), exterior entrance doors at the rear of the building. One is the entrance to the oil storage room, and the other is located next to the main overhead garage door. The one entering the oil storage room measures 36" x 80" left hand out swing. The door located next to the overhead door is a 36" x 80", left hand out swing door.

DUMPSTER SIDE

- There is an exterior door that measures 36" x 80" and is a right hand out swing door.

FRONT SIDE OF BUILDING

- There is an exterior door next to the main overhead door that measures 36" x 80", and is a left hand out swing

OTHER

- Located inside the main office foyer, is a 36" x 84" left hand door that allows access to the main garage area.
- Inside the employee break room is a door that leads to the garage area which is a 36" x 84" left hand door.
- Remove existing entrance steel doors as well as the metal frames. Thoroughly clean remaining concrete opening of all concrete debris. To install the doors, contractor will anchor a pressure treated 2" x 6" around the perimeter of the rough opening and located in the center of the block. The jambs are to be ordered punch and dimpled, and anchored accordingly. The door slabs will be 18 gauge steel, with stainless steel hinges, panic hardware, keyed locksets, and door closures. Exterior doors will also have aluminum thresholds, and rubber door sweeps to keep any rain or snow out. All door hardware to be heavy duty commercial grade stainless steel. Contractor to have new locksets keyed to match the original. Furnish and install a drip cap over each door. NOTE: all existing door hardware to be saved and not disposed of.
- All new door jambs and doors shall have one (1) coat of latex primer and two (2) Coats of semi gloss latex exterior paint.
- Contractor is responsible for all final jobsite clean up.

Contractor is responsible to field verify all door measurements prior to ordering. Any questions or correspondence regarding the project should be directed to the Building Maintenance Superintendent Tim Carroll at (401) 641-8768.

WORK HOURS: Work hours shall be between 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM No work weekends or holidays unless approved by the Facility Superintendent Patrick Maguire in order to avoid any conflicts with operations on site. He can be reached at cell phone number (401)-641-5731.

HOLIDAY WORK SCHEDULE

- a. **Memorial Day, Victory Day, Labor Day, & Columbus Day** - No Saturday, Sunday, or Monday day or night work.
- b. **Thanksgiving Day** – 1.) No Wednesday night or Thursday day or night work.
- c. **Independence Day, Veterans Day, Christmas Day** - No day or night work and no work the previous night.
- d. **Easter** - No Saturday night or Sunday day or night work.

COMPLETION DATE

The Project shall be completed and accepted three (3) months after the award date.

MAINTENANCE ACCESS TO SITE

The Contractor shall at their expense keep their work area free from debris and open to vehicular and personnel traffic at all times unless otherwise authorized by the Superintendent in writing. The Contractor shall conduct their work in such a manner as to not interfere with the RIDOT operations at the site or vehicular traffic.

INCLEMENT WORK STOPPAGE

In the case of inclement weather, work may be stopped by the Superintendent, for a period of time, to allow full and unobstructed access to the entire facility site.

METHOD OF MEASURE: This contract will be measured as a Lump Sum item complete and accepted by The Rhode Island Department of Transportation Division of Highway and Bridge Maintenance.

BASIS OF PAYMENT: This contract will be paid for at the contract Lump Sum price as listed in the proposal. The price so-stated shall constitute full and total compensation for all labor, materials, equipment, tools, transportation and incidental supplies required to complete the work in accordance with the plans, specification and terms of the contract.

DIVISION OF PURCHASES PUBLIC WORKS BID CLAUSES

Offer to Contract

All bid proposals are subject to and constitute an offer to contract with the State of Rhode Island through the Division of Purchases on the terms and conditions contained in this solicitation, any addenda, applicable federal and municipal law, and the laws of the State of Rhode Island, including all procurement statutes and regulations (available at www.purchasing.ri.gov), all of which are incorporated by this reference into any contract awarded pursuant to this solicitation.

The terms and conditions in these Division of Purchases Public Works Bid Clauses supersede any and all inconsistent or conflicting terms and conditions in any other provision of any other document in this solicitation and shall govern this solicitation and the award of any contract pursuant to this solicitation.

Noncompliance

Bidders must comply with all requirements. Any failure to comply may result, at the discretion of the State Purchasing Agent, in the disqualification of the bid proposal.

Failure of the successful bidder to comply with the terms and conditions of the contract awarded pursuant to this solicitation may result in nonpayment, termination of the contract, suspension or debarment of the bidder, or any other necessary or appropriate remedy in the sole discretion of the State Purchasing Agent.

Addenda

Bidders are responsible for checking for addenda, all of which become incorporated into this solicitation upon posting on the Division of Purchases website at www.purchasing.ri.gov. No addenda will be posted within the 5-day period preceding the submission date for bid proposals.

Apprenticeship

The successful bidder must employ apprentices on this project (if the value of the project is at least \$1 Million) in accordance with the apprentice to journey person ratio for each trade approved by the State Apprenticeship Council. Specific information is available at www.dlt.ri.gov/apprenticeship.

Award

The State Purchasing Agent, in his or her sole discretion, will award the contract pursuant to this solicitation to the responsive and responsible bidder who submits the lowest responsive and responsible bid. A binding contract between the State of Rhode Island and the successful bidder will be formed only by the issuance of a Purchase Order by the Division of Purchases.

Bid Proposal Submission

Each bid proposal (a complete package, with the signed Bidder Certification Cover Form) must be submitted in a *separate sealed envelope* with the specific "Bid Number" and the "Submission Date and Time" marked in the upper left-hand corner of the envelope.

The bid proposal must be delivered to the Division of Purchases (via mail or messenger service) by the date and time specified for the submission of bid proposals. Bid Surety

Bidders must furnish, with their bid proposals, either a bid bond from a surety licensed to conduct business in the State of Rhode Island or a certified check payable to the State of Rhode Island in the amount of five (5%) percent of the bid proposal.

Contractors Registration

The bidder must have and maintain a valid certificate of registration issued by the Contractors' Registration Board throughout the term of the contract awarded pursuant to this solicitation and ensure that its subcontractors, unless exempt from registration, also obtain and maintain valid certificates of registration.

Divestiture of Investments in Iran Requirement

No bidder engaged in investment activities in Iran as described in R.I. Gen. Laws §37-2.5-2(b) may submit a bid proposal to, or renew a contract with, the Division of Purchases. Domestic Steel

Any steel products required by the plans and specifications in this solicitation must be fabricated or processed from steel made in the United States.

Equal Opportunity

The successful bidder must demonstrate a commitment to equal opportunity and submit an affirmative action plan for review by the State Equal Opportunity Office.

Foreign Corporations

No foreign corporation may transact business in the State of Rhode Island until it shall have obtained a Certificate of Authority from the Rhode Island Secretary of State. The successful bidder will be required to provide a Good Standing Certificate issued by the Rhode Island Secretary of State within the 10-day period following the tentative letter of award.

Inspection

The bidder is responsible for carefully reviewing all of the requirements of this solicitation, inspecting the project site, including (without limitation) checking and/or verifying measurements, site conditions, any limitations, and other details, prior to preparing and submitting its bid proposal.

Insurance

The successful bidder must submit a certificate of insurance that references the solicitation number and names the State of Rhode Island as “certificate holder” and as “additional insured” upon the issuance of the tentative letter of award, on an annual basis during the term of the contract awarded pursuant to this solicitation, and from time to time upon request. The successful bidder and anyone performing any work on the contract awarded pursuant to this solicitation must possess all of the licenses required by any governmental authority to perform such work.

The State's goal is for a minimum ten per cent (10%) participation by MBE's in all State procurements. Occupational Safety

The successful bidder must ensure (if the total project cost is at least \$100,000) that all employees at the project site possess a card issued by the United States Department of Labor certifying successful completion of an OSHA ten (10) hour construction safety program.

Payment and Performance Bonds

The successful bidder must furnish a 100% payment and performance bond from a surety licensed to conduct business in the State of Rhode Island upon the tentative award of the contract.

Any bidder that does not maintain a permanent workforce and/or proposes to perform a disproportionate amount of the work through one or more subcontractors will be considered unqualified. The Division of Purchases reserves the right to reject any such bid proposal.

Substitutions

Products specified in this solicitation establish a standard of quality, performance, dimension, function, and appearance. Proposed substitutions must meet the standard and will not be considered without the prior written approval of the Division of Purchases. A request for substitution must include the detailed information necessary for a comprehensive evaluation.

Taxes

The State of Rhode Island is exempt from federal excise taxes and state sales and use taxes. The bidder shall not include such taxes in any prices in the bid proposal.

Termination

The Division of Purchases reserves the right to terminate any contract awarded pursuant to this solicitation at any time, for any reason, with or without cause.

Wages

For contracts that total less than \$1 Million

The successful bidder and its subcontractors must pay their workers at the applicable prevailing wage rates (for the various trades) on a weekly basis, pay one and one-half times the applicable prevailing wage rates to any worker who works more than 40 hours in any one week or more than 8 hours in any one day, and submit certified weekly payroll forms on a monthly basis to the agency. Prevailing wage posters and rate schedules, available at the Rhode Island Department of Labor and Training website at www.dlt.ri.gov, must be posted at the project site.

For contracts that may total \$1 Million or Greater

The prevailing wage requirements are generally set forth in RIGL 37-13-1 et seq. These requirements refer to the prevailing rate of pay for regular, holiday, and overtime wages to be paid to each craftsmen, mechanic, teamster, laborer, or other type of worker performing work on public works projects when state or municipal funds exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

All Prevailing Wage Contractors and Subcontractors are required to:

1. Submit to the Awarding Authority a list of the contractor's subcontractors for any part or all of the prevailing wage work in accordance with RIGL § 37-13-4;
2. Pay all prevailing wage employees at least once per week and in accordance with RIGL §37-13-7 (see Appendix B attached);
3. Post the prevailing wage rate scale and the Department of Labor and Training's prevailing wage poster in a prominent and easily accessible place on the work site in accordance with RIGL §37-13-11; posters may be downloaded at www.dlt.ri.gov/pw/Posters.htm or obtained from the Department of Labor and Training, Center General Complex, 1511 Pontiac Avenue, Cranston, Rhode Island;
4. Access the Department of Labor and Training website, at www.dlt.ri.gov on or before July 1st of each year, until such time as the contract is completed, to ascertain the current prevailing wage rates and the amount of payment or contributions for each covered prevailing wage employee and make any necessary adjustments to the covered employee's prevailing wage rates effective July 1st of each year in compliance with RIGL §37-13-8;
5. Attach a copy of this CONTRACT ADDENDUM and its attachments as a binding obligation to any and all contracts between the contractor and any

Employ apprentices for the performance of the awarded contract when the contract is valued at one million dollars (\$1,000,000) or more, and comply with the apprentice to journeyman ratio for each trade approved by the apprenticeship council of the Department of Labor and Training in compliance with RIGL §37-13-3.1;

TITLE 37
Public Property and Works
CHAPTER 37-13
Labor and Payment of Debts by Contractors
SECTION 37-13-5

§ 37-13-5 Payment for trucking or materials furnished - Withholding of sums due. -A contractor or subcontractor on public works authorized by a proper authority shall pay any obligation or charge for trucking and material which have been furnished for the use of the contractor or subcontractor, in connection with the public works being performed by him or her, within ninety (90) days after the obligation or charge is incurred or the trucking service has been performed or the material has been delivered to the site of the work, whichever is later. When it is brought to the notice of the proper authority in a city or town, or the proper authority in the state having supervision of the contract, that the obligation or charge has not been paid by the contractor or subcontractor, the proper authority may deduct and hold for a period not exceeding sixty (60) days, from sums of money due to the contractor or subcontractor, the equivalent amount of such sums certified by a trucker or materialman creditor as due him or her, as provided in this section, and which the proper authority determines is reasonable for trucking performed or materials furnished for the public works.

APPENDIX B

TITLE 37

Public Property and Works

CHAPTER 37-13

Labor and Payment of Debts by Contractors

SECTION 37-13-7

§ 37-13-7 Specification in contract of amount and frequency of payment of wages.

-(a) Every call for bids for every contract in excess of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), to which the state of Rhode Island or any political subdivision thereof or any public agency or quasi-public agency is a party, for construction, alteration, and/or repair, including painting and decorating, of public buildings or public works of the state of Rhode Island or any political subdivision thereof, or any public agency or quasi-public agency and which requires or involves the employment of employees, shall contain a provision stating the minimum wages to be paid various types of employees which shall be based upon the wages that will be determined by the director of labor and training to be prevailing for the corresponding types of employees employed on projects of a character similar to the contract work in the city, town, village, or other appropriate political subdivision of the state of Rhode Island in which the work is to be performed. Every contract shall contain a stipulation that the contractor or his or her subcontractor shall pay all the employees employed directly upon the site of the work, unconditionally and not less often than once a week, and without subsequent deduction or rebate on any account, the full amounts accrued at time of payment computed at wage rates not less than those stated in the call for bids, regardless of any contractual relationships which may be alleged to exist between the contractor or subcontractor and the employees, and that the scale of wages to be paid shall be posted by the contractor in a prominent and easily accessible place at the site of the work; and the further stipulation that there may be withheld from the contractor so much of the accrued payments as may be considered necessary to pay to the employees employed by the contractor, or any subcontractor on the work, the difference between the rates of wages required by the contract to be paid the employees on the work and the rates of wages received by the employees and not refunded to the contractor, subcontractors, or their agents.

(b) The terms "wages", "scale of wages", "wage rates", "minimum wages", and "prevailing wages" shall include:

- (1) The basic hourly rate of pay; and
- (2) The amount of:

(A) The rate of contribution made by a contractor or subcontractor to a trustee or to a third person pursuant to a fund, plan, or program; and

(B) The rate of costs to the contractor or subcontractor which may be reasonably anticipated in providing benefits to employees pursuant to an enforceable commitment to carry out a financially responsible plan or program which was communicated in writing to the employees affected, for medical or hospital care, pensions on retirement or death, compensation for injuries or illness resulting from occupational activity, or insurance to provide any of the foregoing, for unemployment benefits, life insurance, disability and sickness insurance, or accident insurance, for vacation and holiday pay, for defraying costs of apprenticeship or other similar programs, or for other bona fide fringe benefits, but only where the contractor or subcontractor is not required by other federal, state, or local law to provide any of the benefits; provided, that the obligation of a contractor or subcontractor to make payment in accordance with the prevailing wage determinations of the director of labor and training insofar as this chapter of this title and other acts incorporating this chapter of this title by reference are concerned may be discharged by the making of payments in cash, by the making of contributions of a type referred to in subsection (b)(2), or by the assumption of an enforceable commitment to bear the costs of a plan or program of a type referred to in this subdivision, or any combination thereof, where the aggregate of any payments, contributions, and costs is not less than the rate of pay described in subsection (b)(1) plus the amount referred to in subsection (b)(2).

(c) The term "employees", as used in this section, shall include employees of contractors or subcontractors performing jobs on various types of public works including mechanics, apprentices, teamsters, chauffeurs, and laborers engaged in the transportation of gravel or fill to the site of public works, the removal and/or delivery of gravel or fill or ready-mix concrete, sand, bituminous stone, or asphalt flowable fill from the site of public works, or the transportation or removal of gravel or fill from one location to another on the site of public works, and the employment of the employees shall be subject to the provisions of subsections (a) and (b).

(d) The terms "public agency" and "quasi-public agency" shall include, but not be limited to, the Rhode Island industrial recreational building authority, the Rhode Island economic development corporation, the Rhode Island airport corporation, the Rhode Island industrial facilities corporation, the Rhode Island refunding bond authority, the Rhode Island housing and mortgage finance corporation, the Rhode Island resource recovery corporation, the Rhode Island public transit authority, the Rhode Island student loan authority, the water resources board corporate, the Rhode Island health and education building corporation, the Rhode Island higher education assistance authority, the Rhode Island turnpike and bridge authority, the Narragansett Bay water quality management district commission, Rhode Island telecommunications authority, the convention center authority, the board of governors for higher education, the board of regents for elementary and secondary education, the capital center commission, the housing resources commission, the Quonset Point-Davisville management corporation, the Rhode Island children's crusade for higher education, the Rhode Island depositors economic protection corporation, the Rhode Island lottery commission, the Rhode Island

partnership for science and technology, the Rhode Island public building authority, and the Rhode Island underground storage tank board.
