MPA #215 / CR #87 – Radon Measurements

1. On the bid sheet for solicitation #7598637, the item description states 'bid a price per each device.'

Please clarify if this price to include placement and retrieval of the device or just the device only?

Answer: Unit price is to include all costs including but not limited to placement and retrieval of device and analysis of results.

2. Will you accept proposals for the long term follow up devices only?

Answer: Yes.

3. If so, are you expecting the vendor to cover shipping charges to Rhode Island and back to the laboratory for analysis of the long term detector?

Answer: Unit price is to include all costs including but not limited to placement and retrieval of device and analysis of results. Note that all radon measurements must be performed by a radon measurement consultant who is employed by a radon measurement business, and they must both be certified by the State of Rhode Island. Radon analysis or readings must be performed by a State certified radon analytical service.

4. If you expect the vendor to cover shipping back to the laboratory, what quantities and with what frequency do you expect shipments?

Answer: This information is not available.

5. Are there any special reporting requirements for long term detector reports?

Answer: Radon measurements must follow measurement protocols as directed in part C of the Rhode Island Rules and Regulations for Radon Control (or most current regulation).
