

### **PURCHASE ORDER STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THIS PURCHASE ORDER**

#### **INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS (ADDITIONAL)**

ANNUAL RENEWAL INSURANCE CERTIFICATES FOR WORKERS' COMPENSATION, PUBLIC LIABILITY, PROPERTY DAMAGE INSURANCE, AUTO INSURANCE, PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE (AKA ERRORS & OMISSIONS), BUILDER'S RISK INSURANCE, SCHOOL BUSING AUTO LIABILITY, ENVIRONMENTAL IMPAIRMENT (AKA POLLUTION CONTROL), VESSEL OPERATION (MARINE OR AIRCRAFT) PROTECTION & INDEMNITY, ETC., MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE SPECIFIC AGENCY IDENTIFIED IN THE "BILL TO" SECTION OF THE PURCHASE ORDER. **FOREMAN:** OSHA 40 hr trained, responsible for supervision of all personnel on the job site.

**FIELD CLERK:** Field clerks classify, store, retrieve and update information pertaining to the job site.

**LABORER:** OSHA 40 hr trained, responsible to perform work under the direction of the foreman and/or supervisor.

**EQUIPMENT OPERATORS:** OSHA 40 hr trained, responsible for proper operations of company vehicles to include operation of, backhoes, excavators, dump trucks and box trucks.

**TECHNICIAN:** OSHA 40 hr trained, responsible for being skilled in a specific trade.

**TRUCK DRIVER:** OSHA 40 hr trained, responsible for proper operations of company vehicles.

**ELECTRICIAN:** Fully certified and licensed to perform all aspects of electrical work.

**WELDER:** Certificate, responsible for uniting together various types of metals by melting together.

**CARPENTER:** Certificate, responsible for construction and repair of wooden parts.

**BIOLOGIST:** Degree, responsible for the science of plants and animals.

**STAFF GEOLOGIST:** Degree assists in the science of the earth's crust, rock and fossils.

**SENIOR HYDROLOGIST:** Degree, lead expert in the science dealing with the occurrence, circulation, distribution and properties of the water of the earth and atmosphere.

**CHEMIST:** Degree, responsible for the science dealing with the composition, reactions, etc of substances.

**STAFF SCIENTIST:** Degree, assists lead expert in science.



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**DIVER:** Certificate, responsible for work tasks under or in the water.

**ENGINEER:** Degree, responsible for the practical use of sciences.

**TOXOLOGIST:** Degree, responsible for the science of poisons and their effects.

**MARINE CHEMIST:** Degree, responsible for the science dealing with composition, reactions, etc., of the substances in the water.

**INDUST. HYGEINIST:** Degree, expert in industrial hygiene.

**FIELD ACCOUNTANT:** Keeps track of business financial records on the job site.

**SENIOR PROJECT ENGINEER:** Degree, responsible for overall use of sciences on the project.

**SITE SAFETY OFFICER:** OSHA 40 hr trained, performs site safety and health training, and maintains a file of certification for employees.

**PROJECT MANAGER:** OSHA 40 hr trained, ensures that the project is in compliance.

**MAJOR SPILL ADMINISTRATOR:** OSHA 40 hr trained, responsible for the management and direction of the spill.

**DIVE SUPERVISOR:** Certificate, master diver.

**SENIOR MECHANICAL TECHNICIAN:** Certificate, master engineer dealing with machinery.
